## ***The GR Capitol Report***

**SENATE COMMITTEE ADVANCES LEGISLATION:** On April 11, the Senate Transportation Committee approved a House bill this week that will now go to the Senate floor for further debate.

HB 56, sponsored by Rep. David Sater (R-Cassville) designates a memorial bridge and several memorial highways including:

- (1) The portion of State Highway 112 from the intersection of State Highway 76 south to the intersection of State Highway AA in Barry County as the "Deputy Christopher Lee Castetter Memorial Highway";
- (2) The portion of State Route M between Old Lemay Ferry Road and Moss Hollow Road in the City of Barnhart as the "Officer Stephen Strehl Memorial Highway";
- (3) The portion of State Route 7 from the south edge of the city limits of Blue Springs south to the intersection of U. S. Highway 50 as the "Larry Stewart Secret Santa Memorial Highway";
- (4) The new bridge over the Missouri River on Interstate 29/35 in Kansas City as the "Christopher S. Bond Bridge";
- (5) The portion of Interstate 44 from the city limits of St. Louis to the intersection of Kingshighway as the "Officer Michael Barwick Memorial Highway";
- (6) The portion of U. S. Highway 61/67 between Wolf Hollow Road and State Route M in the City of Barnhart as the "1922 Sulphur Springs Rail Disaster Memorial Highway"; and
- (7) The portion of State Highway 110 from U. S. Highway 67 to State Highway 21 in Jefferson County as the "DeSoto Railroad Employees Memorial Highway."

**MHTC/ MoDOT PROPOSAL ADVANCES:** On April 11, the Senate Transportation Committee heard testimony on HB 596, sponsored by Rep. Neal St. Onge (R-Ellisville). The bill would allow the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) to accept an annual bid bond for its construction and maintenance projects. The proposal allows the Commission to prescribe the form and content of the annual bid bond.

Jay Wunderlich, Governmental Relations liaison testified in support of the bill. There was no opposition to the bill and the committee took no action.

HB 596 is one of the MHTC/MoDOT priority bills for the 2007 session.

## **VOIDANCE OF OUTDOOR ADVERTISING PERMITS / UCR PROPOSAL MOVES**

**FORWARD:** On April 11, the Senate Transportation Committee heard testimony on an omnibus transportation bill - HCS HB 744, sponsored by Rep. Neal St. Onge (R-Ellisville). The bill has three main components:

### *Voidance of ODA Permits*

This bill authorizes the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) to void outdoor billboard permits without paying compensation when:

- 1) There has been any misrepresentation of a material fact by the applicant on a permit application and the sign is removed under law;
  
- (2) The Commission determines that a change has been made to a conforming sign by the owner and the sign has been removed under law; or
  
- (3) The Commission determines that a substantial change has been made to a nonconforming sign by the sign owner so that the sign's nonconforming status was terminated and the sign was removed under the commission's administrative rules for maintenance of nonconforming signs.

The Commission may also void any permit when it determines that a permit has been erroneously issued by any MoDOT staff member in violation of any state law or administrative rule. The billboard must be subject to removal, and compensation must be paid according to the provisions of law.

Federal sanctions of transportation funds are at risk this legislative session, if the Missouri legislature does not pass this proposal in 2007.

### *Unified Carrier Registration*

The bill also authorizes the MHTC to take the necessary steps to implement and administer a state plan to conform with the Unified Carrier Registration Act (UCR Act) of 2005. The UCR Act includes provisions to eliminate the Single State Registration System (SSRS) and replace it with the Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Agreement.

The bill allows the Commission may submit to the proper federal authorities, amend and carry out a state plan to qualify as a base-state and to participate in the UCR plan and administer the UCR Agreement. The Commission is authorized to administer the UCR registration of Missouri domiciled motor carriers, motor private carriers, brokers, freight forwarders, and leasing companies, and persons domiciled in non-participating states who have designated Missouri as their base-state under the UCR Act. The Commission is further authorized to receive, collect, process, deposit, transfer, distribute, and refund UCR registration fees.

Under the act, every motor carrier, motor private carrier, broker, freight forwarder, and leasing company that has its principal place of business within Missouri, and every such person who has designated this state as the person's base-state under the provisions of the UCR Act, shall timely complete and file with the Commission all the forms required by the UCR agreement and the UCR implementing regulations, and shall pay the required UCR registration fees to the Commission.

Without the passage of this UCR proposal this year, Missouri could lose about \$3.5 million in commercial motor carrier registration fees to other states who have a federal registration system already in place. The commercial motor carrier industry supports this legislation.

CDL Requirement

Finally, another provision in the bill relates to any person convicted of driving while “out of service” will be disqualified from operating a commercial motor vehicle in the manner specified by federal regulations.

The expungement of a minor in possession violation for a holder of a commercial driver's license or a person operating a commercial motor vehicle at the time of the offense is prohibited. No records can be expunged for a commercial driver's license holder until three years after the date of the suspension or revocation if the person was holding a commercial driver's license at the time of the offense or who has been convicted of or pled guilty to an offense where the person's blood-alcohol content is .04 or above.

Failure to appear in court or pay fines by a commercial license holder or operator of a commercial motor vehicle is included as a commercial driver's license offense requiring indefinite suspension until he or she is in compliance.

Unless passed during this legislative session, federal highway road funds could be reduced until this issue is addressed in statute.

Testifying in support of the bill was MoDOT’s Jay Wunderlich, Governmental Relations and Jeff Glenn, liaison for the Department of Revenue. There was no opposition to the bill and the committee took no action on the proposal.

**UNIFIED CARRIER REGISTRATION BILL PASSES BOTH HOUSE AND SENATE TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEES:**

On April 11, during an executive session, the House Transportation Committee voted to approve SB 200, sponsored by Sen. Bill Stouffer (R-Napton). This bill, would allow Missouri to participate in the Unified Carrier Registration program and continue collecting registration fees from motor carriers rather than those carriers submitting fees to another state that participates in the program. The bill was approved as a “consent” bill and therefore no amendments can be added to the bill during floor debate.

The bill will now go to the House floor for consideration.

**MEMORIAL HIGHWAY DESIGNATION - AGAIN - A TOPIC OF DEBATE:** On April 11, the House Transportation Committee held a hearing on SB 232, sponsored by Sen. Jason Crowell (R-Cape Girardeau). SB 232 designates a portion of Rt. 74/34 in Cape Girardeau as the “John Oliver Jr. Parkway” and a portion of Highway 60 contained in Stoddard County as the “Sergeant Carl Dewayne Graham Jr. Memorial Highway.”

Testifying in support of the bill was Capt. Bret Johnson, Missouri State Highway Patrol. There was no opposition to the bill. During an executive session of the committee the bill was approved by a vote of 9 to 0.

The bill now goes to the House floor for debate.

The Committee also discussed SB 395, sponsored by Sen. Ryan McKenna (D-Crystal City). SB 395 designates a portion of State Route M between Old Lemay Ferry Road and Moss Hollow Road in the City of Barnhart as the "Officer Stephen Strehl Memorial Highway."

No action was taken on the bill.

**BRIDGE NAMING PROPOSALS ON THE MOVE:** On April 10, the House Special Committee on Government Affairs heard HB 1128, sponsored by Rep. Ryan Silvey (R-Kansas City). HB 1128 would designate the new Paseo Bridge/KCICON as the "Christopher Bond Memorial Bridge."

Testifying in support of this proposal was Mayor Kay Barnes, Kansas City Mayor who stated the U.S. Senator has been an enormous contributor to the state of Missouri and his leadership has helped bring significant federal funds to Missouri.

Also testifying for the bill was Fred Dreiling, on behalf of Dan Tarwater with the Jackson County Legislature.

During an executive session, the committee approved HB 1128 with two amendments. The first amendment, offered by Rep. Silvey, would allow the General Assembly to override the current statutory highway/bridge application naming process (adopted into law by the legislature in 2005) by allowing the House or Senate to pass a proposal with a 2/3's majority vote. Rep. Silvey stated that if the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission have authority to name highways and bridges without legislative approval then the General Assembly should have that same flexibility. A second amendment was offered by Rep. Curt Dougherty (D-Independence). This amendment would designate a portion of State Route 7 from the south edge of the city limits of Blue Springs south to the intersection of U. S. Highway 50 as the "Larry Stewart Secret Santa Memorial Highway."

These amendments were rolled into a substitute bill and approved by the committee. The bill now goes to the House floor for debate.

**GOVERNOR'S EXECUTIVE ORDER TRANSFERS BREATH ALCOHOL PROGRAM TO MODOT:** On April 1, Executive Order 07-05 went into effect with no opposition from members of the General Assembly.

EO 07-05 moves from the Department of Health and Senior Services to MoDOT's Highway Safety Division the state's responsibility to license and regulate the chemical analysis used in determining the alcohol or drug content of motor vehicle and watercraft operators. Specifically, the Breath Alcohol Program is responsible for performing on-site inspection of breath analyzers, as well as, approving permits to operate and maintain evidential breath analyzers; permits to analyze blood, urine and saliva for drugs; and courses to instruct permit holders in the use of breath analyzer equipment.

This proposal was a recommendation of the Missouri State Government Review Commission in its November 2005 Report.

Specifically, the EO allows for:

1. Transfer all the authority, powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, contracts, budgets, matters pending, and other pertinent vestiges of the Breath Alcohol Program from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to the Missouri Department of Transportation, by Type I transfer, as defined under the Reorganization Act of 1974; and
2. Develop mechanisms and processes necessary to effectively transfer the Breath Alcohol Program to the Missouri Department of Transportation; and
3. Transfer the responsibility for staff support for the Breath Alcohol Program from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to the Missouri Department of Transportation; and
4. Take the steps necessary to maintain compliance with federal requirements, so as not to jeopardize federal financial participation with this consolidation.

Staff members from the Department of Health and the Division of Highway Safety are currently working on agreements to make the transfer as seamless as possible in an attempt to not interfere with pending court cases.

**MoDOT'S BUDGET CONTINUES TO BE REVIEWED:** This week the Senate Appropriations Committee continued its review of HB 4, which contains MoDOT's appropriations for fiscal year 2008. While the bill was in the House, the \$6.3 million general revenue appropriation for Amtrak was removed. The Senate Appropriations Committee, however, reinstated the entire appropriation to Amtrak. The bill will now go to the full Senate for debate. Still on the table for discussion is HB 19, which contains a Department of Public Safety budget request for \$7.2 million from the State Highway and Transportation Department Fund to pay for phase 1 in building a statewide interoperable radio system to be used by all participating public safety entities in the state.
